

Pattern 5562: Lady's Breeches

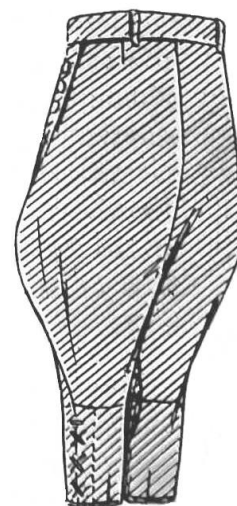
Issued in *Madame Weigel's Journal of Fashion* in January 1930, these Lady's Breeches were described as:

'well-fitting breeches ... suitable for both riding and walking. They are laced at the side of the calf, and are finished at the waist with a belt passed through tabs.'

Suitable materials to make these breeches, or jodhpurs, included wool or cotton gabardine, cotton khaki, drill, or cotton corduroy.

The breeches teamed up with *Pattern 5080: Lady's Shirt Blouse*, originally issued in the journal in September 1925.

Seven sizes were offered, from waist 22 inches to 36 inches. The pattern cost 1s.
